Trellis and Rose

It's that time of year when the new growth on a rambling rose needs attaching to a trellis for support; but it's too late to try and slip in a trellis now, that needed to be in place long before the new growth.

I've been thinking of a different sort of trellis and rose. Back in early March I mentioned the idea of the trellis and rose to Ellie and Fliss who respectively head up our Super Saints and Youth teams. The new resource and systems which Super Saints are implementing as well as the resource used by Youth (the trellis) enable All Saints to welcome new families and enable their children (the roses) to be discipled with a rich programme of spiritual food and fun so that they might grow as disciples filled with the new life of Jesus. Reports are showing that the younger generations are showing an increased interest in finding out about God and are asking to go to Church. In his kingdom which has no end, the Lord is adding daily those who are being saved. They are coming home! Are we ready? What does a warm, genuine and committed welcome look like for these home-comers coming to God's Church here in Wick? Begin dreaming, thinking and praying with one another what part of the trellis you will team up and build.

BIBLE READING

Matthew 28: 16-20

16 Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. 17 When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. 18 Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.'

Galatians 3:21-29

21 Is the law, therefore, opposed to the promises of God? Absolutely not! For if a law had been given that could impart life, then righteousness would certainly have come by the law. 22 But Scripture has locked up everything under the control of sin, so that what was promised, being given through faith in Jesus Christ, might be given to those who believe. 23 Before the coming of this faith, we were held in custody under the law, locked up until the faith that was to come would be revealed. 24 So the law was our guardian until Christ came that we might be justified by faith. 25 Now that this faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian. 26 So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, 27 for all of you who were baptised into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. 28 There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. 29 If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

Ephesians 4:1-6

I As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. 2 Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. 3 Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. 4 There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism; 6 one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.
