Ephesians 2:11-22

11 Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called 'uncircumcised' by those who call themselves 'the circumcision' (which is done in the body by human hands) – 12 remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. 13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. 14 For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, 15 by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, 16 and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. 17 He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. 18 For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit. 19 Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, 20 built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. 21 In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. 22 And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.

SERMON NOTES - What's God been saying to you today?

'And Can It Be...?'

Last Sunday, we had a moment at the 9am at All Saints - not because everything went smoothly, but precisely because it didn't. We were due to sing "And Can It Be," that great hymn of awe and wonder at the grace of God. But when the technology let us down, the words didn't appear.

We tried. Some of us sang with confidence, others quietly hummed along, and many of us mumbled the lines we half-knew. It wasn't for lack of love or enthusiasm. It was simply that we couldn't remember all the words.

It struck me, in that moment, how easy it is to forget even familiar truths when we don't have them in front of us. If we can't accurately recall one well-loved hymn, how much harder is it to rely on memory alone when it comes to Scripture which is God's living Word?

The Bible is a gift, of 66 books, hundreds of chapters, thousands of verses, all breathed out by God for our good. He caused it to be written down not as a religious formality, but as a lifeline. He knew we would need to return to it again and again to be reminded, refreshed, and re-rooted in the truth.

Without it, we risk creating a Jesus of our own imagination, shaped more by culture or personal comfort than by the Gospels. That's like building our house on sand. But with it, by reading it, listening to it, meditating on it, we build on solid rock.

Maybe our recent sermon series on Jesus: Marriage & Relationships stirred questions in you. 'Did God really say...?' You wouldn't be the first to ask. But God's Word invites us not into confusion, but clarity. Not into fear, but peace.

May I gently encourage you: if you've fallen out of the habit of reading or listening to the Bible regularly, today is a great day to begin, or to begin

again. There are so many helpful plans, apps, audio versions, and devotionals to guide you. Choose what suits you best. YouVersion app has many plans to choose from. *Try Everyday With Jesus (now also as an App), Bible Reading Fellowship, Scripture Union, Bible Society...*

God has spoken, and He still speaks, every day. Let's be a people who listen.
