God, our refuge and strength, bring near the day when wars shall cease and poverty and pain shall end, that earth may know the peace of heaven through Jesus Christ our Lord.

He Himself Is Our Peace

This Sunday we pause in silence to remember those who gave their lives in war, those who still bear its wounds, and those who long for peace in our world today. It is a solemn act, yet one rooted in hope, for we remember in the light of Christ.

As we gather together on Sunday Isaiah 9 reminds us that 'He Himself is our peace.' The prophet foretold a child who would be called Prince of Peace, the One whose light shines in the darkness and whose kingdom will never end.

Outside the church, our beautiful display of knitted poppies, lovingly created by our Knit & Damp; Natter group, stands as a tribute to the courage and sacrifice of the servicemen from Wick. This week we have also received a moving gift from the children and staff of Rustington Community Primary School: a remembrance wreath made from their painted handprints, each one a small reminder that peace is the work of every generation.

As we gather, we remember the cost of peace, we honour those who have gone before us, and we place our trust anew in the One who alone can bring lasting peace to our hearts and to our world.

Let's pause wherever we are right now to pray.

Lord Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace, shine your light into our darkness. Bring healing where there is hurt, hope where there is despair, and peace where there is war.

Teach us to walk in your ways and to be instruments of peace in your name. Amen

BIBLE READING

Isaiah 9:1-7

1 Nevertheless, there will be no more gloom for those who were in distress. In the past he humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the future he will honour Galilee of the nations, by the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan – 2 The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. 3 You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder. 4 For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor. 5 Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire. 6 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. 7 Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and for ever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.
