## COLLECT (Worldwide Anglican prayer) for The Eighteenth Sunday after Trinity

God, our judge and saviour, teach us to be open to your truth and to trust in your love, that we may live each day with confidence in the salvation which is given through Jesus Christ our Lord.

### Love and Challenge – The Way of Jesus

Jesus perfectly modelled a life of deep love and bold challenge. He loved people unconditionally, eating with tax collectors (Luke 5:30), showing compassion to the broken (Mark 1:41), and welcoming the outcast. But He also never shied away from speaking hard truths. To the rich young ruler, He “*looked at him and loved him*”, and then challenged him to give up everything and follow Him (Mark 10:21).

Jesus’ love was the kind of love that calls us to repentance, transformation, and wholehearted discipleship. As His followers, we’re called to the same balance: to love people as they are, and to lovingly call one another to grow in holiness and obedience to Christ.

Let’s be a church family that holds love and challenge together, where people feel deeply welcomed, and also deeply called to follow Jesus with everything they have.

## BIBLE READING

### Mark 10: 17–22

17 As Jesus started on his way, a man ran up to him and fell on his knees before him. ‘Good teacher,’ he asked, ‘what must I do to inherit eternal life?’  
18 ‘Why do you call me good?’ Jesus answered. ‘No one is good – except God alone. 19 You know the commandments: “You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honour your father and mother.”’ 20 ‘Teacher,’ he declared, ‘all these I have kept since I was a boy.’ 21 Jesus looked at him and loved him. ‘One thing you lack,’ he said. ‘Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me.’  
22 At this the man’s face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth.

## John 7:53–8:11

53 Then they all went home,

### Chapter 8

*1 but Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. 2 At dawn he appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered round him, and he sat down to teach them. 3 The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group 4 and said to Jesus, ‘Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. 5 In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?’ 6 They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. 7 When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, ‘Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.’ 8 Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground. 9 At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. 10 Jesus straightened up and asked her, ‘Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?’ 11 ‘No one, sir,’ she said. ‘Then neither do I condemn you,’ Jesus declared. ‘Go now and leave your life of sin.’*
