BIBLE READING

Luke 22: 31-34, 54-62

31 'Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift all of you as wheat. 32 But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned back, strengthen your brothers.' 33 But he replied, 'Lord, I am ready to go with you to prison and to death.' 34 Jesus answered, 'I tell you, Peter, before the cock crows today, you will deny three times that you know me.'

54 Then seizing him, they led him away and took him into the house of the high priest. Peter followed at a distance. 55 And when some there had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and had sat down together, Peter sat down with them. 56 A servant-girl saw him seated there in the firelight. She looked closely at him and said, 'This man was with him.' 57 But he denied it. 'Woman, I don't know him,' he said. 58 A little later someone else saw him and said, 'You also are one of them.' 'Man, I am not!' Peter replied. 59 About an hour later another asserted, 'Certainly this fellow was with him, for he is a Galilean.' 60 Peter replied, 'Man, I don't know what you're talking about!' Just as he was speaking, the cock crowed. 61 The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word the Lord had spoken to him: 'Before the cock crows today, you will disown me three times.' 62 And he went outside and wept bitterly.

John 21: 15-19

15 When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' 'Yes, Lord,' he said, 'you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my lambs.' 16 Again Jesus said, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He answered, 'Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Take care of my sheep.' 17 The third time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' He said, 'Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my sheep. 18 Very truly I tell you, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and

lead you where you do not want to go.' 19 Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, 'Follow me!'

Heroes who trusted God - Meet Lucy & Andrew Amukowa...

Lucy was orphaned at birth. She was brought up by her grandmother, and was so poor that she was asked not to attend church when visitors were expected – she was an embarrassment to them. On one such Sunday, she sat alone praying. She asked God to provide the money she needed for school fees. At that moment a hawk, flying overhead lost its grasp on a chick it had just caught. It fell into Lucy's lap. Lucy nurtured the bird, and it grew up and hatched many young. A local teacher accepted them instead of school fees. Lucy has a passion to see orphans and widows cared for – physically, emotionally, and spiritually. This passion led to RUSH (Reaching the Unreached through Self Help). Her vision is to take the love of Jesus to those who have no one. What this looks like is welcoming orphans into her own family, offering a free (and top quality) education to orphans, vocational training, a weekly fellowship for widows, feeding programs, free medical days, small investment for start-up businesses, and of course the good news of Jesus. RUSH started in Kakamega – a city in Kenya's Western province. It now has a sister work in Butere, a town west of Kakamega. Andrew was shunned by his family as "useless." He met Lucy in the slums of Nairobi. Married life for them began on a wage of 45p a day. Andrew shares Lucy's passion and uses his organisational and business skill to generate income for RUSH and job opportunities for older orphans. He has masterminded the building of The RUSH Academy (the RUSH School) and helps coordinate the large team of staff and volunteers that help RUSH. Andrew loves football and is currently the chairman for the football association in Western Province. He is sometimes on staff with the Kenyan national team. Andrew & Lucy also lead a church, which is based in Butere. Lucy works with 400 pastors across Kenya.
