Please bring your Bible to open or turn on in the service (our readings are NIV 2011). As you dwell on God's word, pray and ask him what is saying to you or wanting you to do as a result.

SERMON NOTES – What has God said today? What will I do about it?

Freedom! Setting God's people free – We begin a new series this week. We will once again be visiting the book of Exodus to see how God rescued his people from slavery so that they might know him, worship him, and live in his presence. Exodus tells the great story of God's rescue and points us to the even greater salvation won for us by Jesus Christ. Today, we as the people of God, let us remember, 'It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.' (Galatians 5:1) We will explore it further together in our home and discipleship groups, also taking in some of the excellent teaching on Exodus from New Wine.

7pm Service – Tonight at Wick Hall. Come for an hour in God's presence. An hour of worship and prayer and prayer ministry in the power of the Holy Spirit. Doors open 6.45pm for refreshments.
