The older students are carrying the younger children to get their lunches. The school closed for a few days until it was safe to return.










#### **Update on changes at Unity School**

The February Newsletter we reported on changes to the in education system in Kenya. The managers and staff at Unity School worked hard to comply with the new system. There are now two sections to the school: Unity Freretown Nursery and Primary School and, similarly sounding, Unity Freretown Lower Secondary School.



A late change in the directive from the government allowed the Lower Secondary School to be housed in the same premises as the Primary School. Three Trustees, visiting Unity School in March, discovered that too much work was required on the rooms hired to comply with the original government requirements, to make them fit for purpose. A conversation was initiated with the contractor who built the Parry Building to discuss what could be done to provide more rooms using the top floor of the Parry Building. A few days later he came back to us with an offer to build five rooms (as per the original plans for the building). The charity would pay for three rooms at £8000 each and his colleague would finance the other two. This was an offer too good to refuse—the only problem, we did not have £24,000. After a few phone calls, we had offers of interest free loans and an agreement to stagger the payments, that would enable work to commence. Work began almost immediately, as did the fundraising. A further offer to fund a classroom from *Natural Tours and Safaris* has moved us closer to paying the bill.
